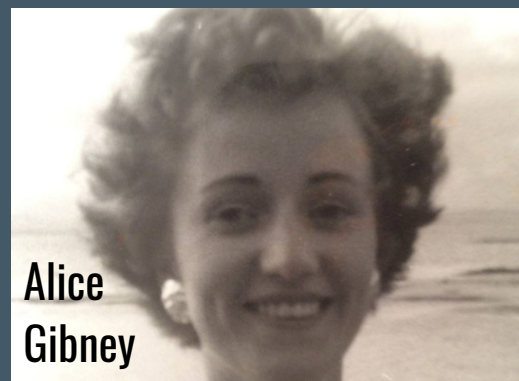
Advice from a Dublin Mother
